RE: Special Session on Wildfires and the State of Insurance

Dear Governor Newsom:

We are writing to urgently call for a special legislative session to address the escalating wildfire crisis and its destabilizing impact on the California insurance market. The recent wildfires in Los Angeles have resulted in the tragic loss of nearly a dozen lives and have devastated thousands of homes, businesses, and acres of land. This growing crisis demands immediate and decisive action.

California currently spends between \$6 billion and \$9 billion annually responding to wildfires but the 2024-25 budget allocated only \$200 million for prevention efforts. This imbalance leaves our communities vulnerable and unprepared for the increasing severity of wildfires. Moreover, the potential statewide claims exposure of the California FAIR Plan exceeds \$400 billion. The heightened wildfire risk threatens to trigger additional insurance rate hikes, impacting all California policyholders and deepening the instability of the state's insurance market.

Alarmingly, California is already grappling with severe fires this year, well before the traditional fire season. We cannot afford to delay action. A special session is imperative to prevent further disasters. This session must prioritize:

- Expedite Permitting for Wildfire Prevention Projects

  Fast-track critical projects such as controlled burns and post-fire reconstruction to mitigate fire risks efficiently.
- Streamline Environmental Reviews for Fire Safety Efforts
  Introduce targeted reforms to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for wildfire prevention initiatives, including underground powerlines and constructing emergency egress routes for community safety.

### • Enhanced Criminal Penalties

Create enhanced criminal penalties for both arson and negligent fires.

### Home-Hardening Incentives and Assistance

Use a combination of tax credits, deductions, grants, and loans to help Californians afford the home-hardening upgrades necessary to protect their property.

# Increased Funding for Wildfire Prevention

Allocate resources to local governments and conservation districts with firsthand knowledge and strategies for effective wildfire prevention and safety projects.

## Insurance Market Transparency

Provide a clear evaluation of the California FAIR Plan and the broader insurance industry, outlining necessary steps to stabilize the market and attract private insurers back into the state. This includes evaluating how current and proposed policies can restore confidence in the California insurance landscape.

California is facing an unprecedented crisis. Continuing on the same path will only yield the same devastating outcomes. Bold, immediate action is required to protect our communities, stabilize the insurance market, and prevent future tragedies. We urge you to convene a special session without delay to address these pressing issues.
